The "early-bird" registration deadline is April 30, but online registration is open through May 16. Synod Assembly is the annual governing body for the Delaware-Maryland Synod, where voting members debate and approve the budget and other resolutions, and hear about the work of our wider church.

We are very thankful for everyone's generosity to get this project completed.


OWLS (Older Wiser Lutheran Seniors)
